The Mission of WATI ...

Wisconsin Assistive Technology Initiative assists school districts and Birth to 3 programs in their responsibility to ensure that every child in Wisconsin who may need assistive technology (AT) has equal and timely access to appropriate assessment and the provision and implementation of needed AT devices and services.

The goal is to improve the outcomes and results for children with disabilities birth to 21 through the use of assistive technology to access services, curriculum, and school and community activities. The project increases the capacity of early intervention agencies, school districts, and their partners to provide assistive technology by making training and technical assistance available throughout Wisconsin.

Access to AT

Lending Library

The WATI Lending Library is available to professionals in public schools, child care centers, Head Start programs, and Birth to 3 programs in Wisconsin. Over 700 pieces of equipment, software and resource materials are available for preview and trial use to help aid in purchase decisions. The full list of available items can be found on our online searchable database at www.wati.org.

Used Equipment Marketplace

This service, similar to classified ads, allows individuals to obtain, sell, donate, loan or rent used equipment valued at \$25 or more. There is no charge to advertise. The ads appear in the *Monitor* newsletter and on the WATI website. WATI connects buyers with sellers of used equipment and does not store the equipment.

State Buys

WATI negotiates with AT vendors to offer a special price to Wisconsin residents. This service helps lower the cost of AT for school districts. State buys are posted on the WATI website.

Training

Regional Consultants

Awareness, knowledge, and mastery level training is provided throughout the state on a variety of topics related to AT to interested persons working in public schools, child care centers, Head Start programs, and Birth to 3 programs. Training opportunities are advertised on the WATI website, in the *Monitor*, and various Cooperative Educational Service Agency (CESA) newsletters and through direct mailing.

Training is available at no or low cost and can be scheduled by contacting your WATI consultant at your local CESA office or the main WATI office. WATI staff are available to teach a variety of workshops on topics related to the provision of assistive technology services to children with disabilities, including assessment.

AT Across the Lifespan

WATI co-sponsors an annual conference with WisTech, Wisconsin's Tech Act Project. It brings service providers, consumers, and AT vendors together to share the latest technology and implementation strategies. The conference offers pre-conference workshops as well as concurrent sessions that address AT issues related to individuals with disabilities across all ages.
